Level progression

Each run, deemed clean by the video judge, will receive 2 points towards the dog's current level. *Please note, results will not count towards Byes for next years Opens.*

Course level

Each class will consist of a set up at a Senior/Champ level with international challenges.

Video submissions

-You will be required to post videos where all equipment can be clearly seen.

-You must be able to film from any angle along the 60' side of the ring, as each class will have a stipulated place where the video must be filmed from.

-Based upon the individual class rules detailed below, clear and faulted runs may be posted. If you have a good run with a knocked jump bar, missed weave entry, missed contact etc... it is still worth posting and receiving a score.

-Please do not submit eliminations, all non submitted runs will be scored as an E.

Requirements for participating in the Open

1. Must have access to the 80' x 60' ring size
2. Must have access to the necessary agility equipment
3. Must be able to video your runs from any angle on the 60' sides of the ring.
4. Must have access to Facebook to upload your video
5. Must be able to read either PDF documents or Clean Run Course designer 4.
6. Must have access to a course-measuring wheel.
7. READ the entire premium!

Equipment Required

Courses will be nested each day as much as possible with the attempt to keep the larger equipment in the same area. The tunnel length (15ft) may NOT be substituted for another size. Wingless jumps may only be substituted for winged jumps where listed and done so at your own risk, this will be based on only where the course measuring is not affected.

This will be stated in the final equipment list released on the UKI web page Oct 23. Equipment must look like it meets competition specs detailed in the UKI Rule book. Slat-less contacts are acceptable. Please see pg 10 below for the listing of each class's equipment requirements.

Course maps released

Friday set up course maps with coordinates only for the placement of the equipment (not numbered), will be released on the Facebook page November 12 at 12 noon Eastern time. Numbered course maps will be available daily for download on the Facebook page by 6.30am EST.

Shared Facility application

In locations that are not under group restrictions, you may apply with UKI to open your facility for local competitors of 4 people or more, to run the class events at your location and who can ensure the below rules are followed. Facilities must contact UKI directly before November 10.

info@ukagilityinternational.com to apply for approval. Please do not apply if there is risk that you will cancel – as no refund will be given to competitors if you cancel after entries have closed. **Users of the shared facility are solely responsible for running the correct courses and understanding the event rules.**

Entry Requirements

- All handlers and dogs must be registered with UKI to enter the event. Registration must be created and paid online at www.ukagilityinternational.com
- You must have access to all equipment that meets UKI specs. Refer to the current Rule Book (6th Edition), which can be found on our web page.
- You must have the entire space of 80ft x 60ft for the ring size without any obstructions in the ring area.
- You must have a course-measuring wheel available to accurately set up and measure the course.
- You must be able to film the entire course area from any camera angle along a 60' side.
- You must have access to a Facebook account and will be required to join a private Facebook group to post your runs. **<https://www.facebook.com/groups/749499985662882>**

General Competition Rules

- This event is open to all dogs and handlers irrespective of their level in UKI.
- Entry is Open to everyone, in all classes with no pre-qualification necessary, with the exception of the Masters Series Final (However you may qualify for the Final by the Masters Heat at this event at which time you can be added into the Final class.)
- Each class is a separate competition for each jump height
- Dogs may only compete in one height throughout the whole event.
- Dogs may only compete with one handler through the entire event.
- Handlers who have earned a bye into Round 2 of the UKI Nationals and/or qualified for the Masters Series Final during the previous qualifying period, must be the same dog and handler partnerships that compete in this event.
- The dog must run in the height that the Q's and Bye's were gained at.
- Classes will be run under UKI rules and regulations with additional rules detailed below. Any further amendments will be posted on the official Facebook page for the event, which you will be added to once entries are finalized.
- Where there may be a tie for a progression place, both dogs will go through to the next round.
- In the event of a tie for a top 3 overall, both dogs will be awarded the result.
- All competitors are expected to build the courses as close as possible to the exact measurements and positions which will be detailed on the course set up maps. You will be required to accurately measure the course with a course-measuring wheel using UKI's course measuring procedure (center to center) and will be detailed for each course. You will be required to submit your course length in feet and inches with each of your runs. (Measuring procedure is detailed in the UKI rule book which we suggest to read ahead of time)
- A picture will be provided of the course layout from the side of the ring you will be required to film at for a comparison of what your course should look like.
- Video judges will also judge the set up of your course. If a judge concludes that your course has been built to ease angles or make for a faster course, for each obstacle deemed so, the judge will either fault the run 5 faults or a 5 second addition to the course time will be added. Please be aware that the judge's decision is final on this and any rebuttal from a competitor will result in elimination for that run.
- You are responsible to join this show's private Facebook group listed above
- **You must join this page no later than 12 noon EST – November 12**
- Each course entry will buy you a course map but each dog competing with must be entered.
- Course maps will be posted on the Facebook page only in both PDF and CRCD4 text formats listed within the posts. Maps will not be emailed for this event.

- Refusal judging will consist of run-by type refusals, missed weave entries, and contact refusals will be judged in classes where refusals are normally judged – regardless of your dog's level. Hesitations, spins, deviation type refusals will not be judged.
- Dogs will be timed from submitted videos and other faults will be assessed such as missed contacts, weave faults, dropped jump bars and wrong courses.
- Electronic timing may be used and submitted if the timing can clearly show the dog starting and stopping the time and the time shown without any video editing. Judges will deem if it is usable.
- Submitted videos must clearly show the dog performing each obstacle using the camera angle stated for each class. For each obstacle where the dog cannot be seen performing the obstacle, a minimum of 5 faults will be assessed.
- Please keep in mind, contact zones are judged as your video presents. If a view is blocked or unclear, the judge will fault either as a missed contact or based on the previous bullet point. We suggest practicing your camera angle for the contacts.
- Submitted videos should be clean runs or course faulted runs. Elimination runs should not be submitted.
- No food or toys may be within the ring boundary while runs are being performed and may not be on your person.
- To ensure the welfare of dogs in not having been overworked or exhausted during multiple attempts at the course, the video must start 5 seconds before the dog taking the first obstacle and continue to run 5 seconds after the dog completes the last obstacle. This will allow us to analyze the state of the dog. If the dog is judged to have been over-worked or not fit for competing, we will eliminate the dog and remove the video from the Facebook page. An Elimination score will be given if this time is not shown.
- During the 5 seconds before and after, the dog must be in video shot during this time. You may feed and play with your dog during these times. But once you begin, food and toys must be left outside the ring area.
- Videos cannot be longer than 90 seconds in length including the 5 seconds before and after the dog begins and ends the course.
- Videos longer than 90 seconds will result in elimination.
- You may not edit your video once the 5 seconds of your dog starts, so plan your set up and video wisely. You may not edit your video if the dog runs out of the shot after the finish. The video must continue to film to show the dog for the full 5 seconds once he is back in video shot. Any editing as described above will result in elimination.
- Each video will need to be submitted by uploading it to the Facebook page you will join. Each class will have its own post. Videos submitted to the wrong post will be eliminated, no exceptions.
- Each day's class video submissions must be posted to the Facebook page by 11.59 PM Pacific Time.
- When you post your video you must comment with the following for the run to be judged
 - ✓ Class name & Jump Height
 - ✓ Handler name & Handler UKI number
 - ✓ Dog name & Dog UKI number
 - ✓ State location – My yard, My field, My Building, Friends facility, OR from an approved facility name.
 - ✓ Course length in feet and inches.
- If 4 or more people are using the same facility it must be registered through UKI for this event. There is no fee for this.
- If a video has been judged, it may not be resubmitted again.
- You may not submit videos or any clips or still shots before posting your video to ask any questions on your video. If you do this, your question will not be answered and your post will be deleted.
- To ensure that late submissions are not accepted, commenting under the individual day's classes will be shut off at midnight Pacific Time. Please be sure you understand this schedule.
- Course designs will be approved for this event and on the whole follow UKI rules and regulations however we retain the right to approve designs considering the appropriateness for this event and ring size.
- No results from this event will go towards the qualifying for next year's US Open event but will count towards level progression.

- Be aware, no refunds will be given after the closing date for any reason. This includes a facility you plan to use, cancelling it's use for this event.
- UKI has the right to alter any rules or procedures they deem necessary including but not limited to technical reasons and government mandate changes.
- UKI reserves the right to rule at the event on anything not covered in these rules and in any exceptional circumstances.

Class descriptions and Rules

Games Challenge Sponsored by Go4Gold Rosettes

- Consists of a Gamblers round and a Snooker round with the results combined.
- Cumulative scoring; highest number of points wins with time as tie breaker only, in all aspects of the Games Challenge
- Eliminations in Gamblers (dog's not crossing the finish line) will score 0 points with 100 seconds as the course time.
- Eliminations in Snooker (dog's not crossing the finish line) will score 0 points with SCT as the course time.
- In the event of a tie for the Games Challenge Champion, the scores from the Snooker round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie both dogs will be awarded joint place.

Agility Biathlon Sponsored by Run It! Ultimate Dog Agility Equipment

- Consists of a Jumping round and Agility round with the results combined.
- Cumulative scoring; least faults wins with time as tie-breaker only, in all aspects of the Biathlon.
- In the event of a tie for the Agility Biathlon Champion, the scores from the Agility round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie both dogs will be awarded joint place.

Speedstakes Challenge Sponsored by 4 Legged Flix

- Consists of 2 Speedstakes rounds with the results combined.
- Cumulative scoring; least faults wins with time as the tie-breaker only.
- In the event of a tie for the Speedstakes Challenge, the scores from 2nd round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie both dogs will be awarded joint place.

Speedstakes TEAM Challenge Sponsored by – Agility University

- 3 dogs of any height, any level, can comprise a team
- One designated team captain must notify the office by email with a team name, list of the handlers and dogs by November 1, 2020
- If entering without a full team, you will be placed into a random draw Team after November 2nd.
- Results from the 2 Rounds of the Speedstakes Challenge will be used as the team runs.
- Teams with the least faults and fastest time wins. In the event of a tie, the result from Rd 1 will take be the decider.

Masters Series Heat - Sponsored by Get Dirty Collars and Leashes

- Consists of a Jumping round and Agility round with results combined.
- Cumulative scoring; dog with the lowest score wins.
- Faults converted into seconds (5 faults = 5 seconds) and time faults treated the same as course faults converted on a 1:1 ratio.
- Winners in each height of the Agility round and the Jumping round qualify for the Masters Agility Final.
- Aggregate placements based on class entry will also qualify for the Master Series Final: 1-5 dogs entered – places

1st and 2nd, 6-10 dogs entered places 1st – 3rd, over 10 dogs entered places 1st – 4th

- In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Agility round will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie, both dogs will progress.
- Eliminations will result in 50 faults with a 50 second course time.
- Dogs that score 200 and over will not be placed.
- Anyone may enter this class even if already qualified for the Masters Agility Final.

Masters Agility Video Final - Sponsored by 1-TDC

DO NOT ENTER THIS UNLESS YOU HAVE ALREADY QUALIFIED. IF YOU QUALIFY FOR THE FINAL DURING THIS EVENT FROM THE MASTERS HEAT, WE WILL ADD IT ON FOR YOU.

- All handler and dog partnerships who had qualified for the US Open Masters Final during the qualifying season between Sept 30, 2019– Sept 30, 2020 are eligible to enter directly into this class.
- Competitors must supply date and show name where qualified for the Masters Final on the Bye information form requested during the entry procedure. Remember, these can only have been gained at a US event.
- This class will be a one off Agility round
- Faults converted into seconds: **5 faults = 3 seconds** (note this is different than the Masters heat). Time faults treated as course faults but converted on a 1:1 ratio.
- In the event of a tie, both dogs will be awarded the place.
- Eliminations will result in 50 faults with a 50 second course time and will not be placed.

US Open National Championship by Video - Sponsored by Assisi Animal Health

- **Any qualifications for Byes into Rd2 & Rd 3 as described below must have been gained through regular trials, US Cups & US Classics between Sept 30, 2019 through Sept 30, 2020.**
- Consists of a Round 1, Round 2, and Final. Rd 1 will be a Jumping class. Rd 2 and the Final will be an Agility class.
- Each round is a separate competition (scores not cumulative).
- In each round the dog with the least faults will be deemed the winner with time used as a tie-breaker.
- **Entry to Rd 2:** The top 50% of the Rd 1 initial entry or top 10 in each height, whichever is higher, will progress to Rd 2 (eliminations will not move forward). Automatic byes are not included in the count of Rd 1 entry count. Rd 2 & Final Byes will not run in Rd 1.
- **Rd 2 Byes:** These dog and handler partnerships must have earned 3 Agility clear runs, 2 Jumping clear runs, 2 Game legs, 1 Speedstakes clear runs (in the height competing in at the US Video Open) between the qualifying dates in their current UKI level. (At home video runs do count, but require 2 video runs each to make 1 regular clear round. Video runs are only ½ a clear round.)
 - Reserve Overall Dog from a UKI US Cups receives Rd 2 byes.
 - Winners of the US Classic Biathlon where one or both runs were clear rounds, receive a Rd 2 bye. Automatic Rd 2 Byes will not run in Rd 1 on Friday. They will run in Rd 2 on Saturday. Bye information must be sent in to UKI at entry of the Open and will be checked for its legitimacy.
- **Entry to Rd 3, Final:** The top 10 from Rd 2 in each height will qualify for the Final (eliminations will not move forward).
 - Overall Winners of the UKI US Cups get a Bye into the 3rd (Final) round.
- Automatic Bye Finalist may still enter Rd 2 and will not affect their Final bye.
- Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UKI.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - By submitting your entry, you have agreed all of the below information, so we strongly urge you to read it.

Refunds are not available for any reason for 2020 US Open by Video.
Please be aware of this policy before you enter and pay.

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the current edition UK Agility International rules found on the UKI web page accept where noted in the above general rules for this trial.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility International in order to compete. UK Agility International's official rules & regulations are available for download on the UKI web page. If you or your dog is not already registered, please register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com
Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of **UK Agility International rules and regulations** including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry and the aforementioned trial general rules:

Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible to compete in UK Agility International Trials, with the exception of dogs over 15 calendar months of age eligible to compete in the Speedstakes Challenge.

Refund Policy – There will be no refunds for any reason after the closing date, including any scenarios where you are unable to run the course. Examples, but not limited to: facility issues or facility cancelation of allowing your use for the runs, weather, equipment failure, ring issues, dog injury, handler injury, government restrictions, internet issues, email issues, Facebook issues, video issues, posting videos too late or incorrectly. To reiterate – No refunds are available once we process entries and we will not reply to any requests.
PLEASE CONSIDER THIS POLICY CAREFULLY BEFORE YOU ENTER.

Masters Final Prize Fund – As there is not a way to guarantee an even competition field due to course building and surfaces for an event structured as such, and for the integrity of competitors and UKI there will be no prize funds at this event. The 2020 Masters Prize fund will roll over to the official 2021 US Open Masters Series Final.

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk. UKI will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property.

A full refund is available **before the closing date** is met for any show. There will be no cost if refund money is to be left in your UKI account. If a refund is requested, then a 4% administration fee for online payment refund will be assessed, per transaction.

Media Rights Release - Through the entry into this event, all competitors grant to UKI and its affiliated companies, representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media known now or in the future. Further, I hereby release UKI and its

affiliates, representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right. I realize that my video(s) submitted will be available for UKI to use for others to view including and not limited to social media pages and other public forums.

Rules of Conduct - UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions. Handlers also promise to keep their own and their dog's welfare and best interests in mind when training and competing.

Each competitor acknowledges through their entry to the UKI event that their participation is a privilege and not a right. By virtue of their entry, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI rules and regulations and all rules and regulations in this premium and agree to accept any sanctions that may be imposed for failure to comply. The video judge has responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to fault a dog, excuse a dog and competitor based on matters related to competitor misconduct. You cannot challenge a video judges call for any reason and or request clarification on a call.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the video judge or UKI officials may take action: Abuse of a dog on the grounds including overworking · Actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog · Willful misconduct or interference with a competitor's right to show · Any acts of poor sportsmanship · Violation of procedural rules · Compulsive, correctional training on the grounds · Willful misrepresentation on entry forms · Edited runs to misrepresent the result · Willful misrepresentation of animals · Dog aggression · Failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog. · Intimidation and/or impolite confrontation of anyone involved in the event.

Social Media Conduct rule is in effect. Cyber bullying of any kind towards UKI, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand, and comments that try to incite further issues. Further, UKI is committed to maintaining an environment that is built on mutual respect and is free from racism, discrimination and harassment. In keeping with this goal, any behavior that is hateful towards race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, ethnicity, sex, and gender will not be tolerated. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing hold harmless provisions, Handler/owner hereby specifically assume sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damages because of bodily injuries, illness, including death, at any time in consequence of my (our) participation in the event or training, howsoever such injury or death may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused or may have been alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents or any other persons. Handler/owner acknowledge all hazards presented by the training facility, event and the event premises, including but not limited to, the condition of grounds, lighting, security, measures or lack of, electrical appliances, fittings, parking areas, fences or the ability for a dog to escape from the training area, the presence of unfamiliar animals and people, the possibility of another ill animal or your own getting ill, and agility equipment; Handler and owner assume the risk of any harm arising from and any and all of these including allowing their dogs to run wearing collars, stop pad protectors, bitch in season pants, or any similar items. We reserve the right to excuse any person for what we deem excessive harshness, or any dog we feel cannot safely perform the obstacles. We reserve the right to excuse any person for what we deem as aggressive or abusive towards another person or dog. UKI will not be held responsible for anyone breaking federal, state, local authorities and or government rules, regulations and mandates. All participants must comply with federal, state, local authorities and or government rules, regulations and mandates.

If your dog needs to move up due to lack of trials as explained in the rulebook, you must email UKI to have this move up completed. Failure to do so will result in a voided result if it needs to be changed after results have posted.
